Description of the semester

The 7th semester thematic framework is ‘Global processes’ and in a number of courses you will be introduced to globalization history, theories and manifestations. Also, you will be trained in methodology to enable you to critically design optimal research strategies.

In your own project (written on the basis of joint courses, in addition to one or a number of stream courses) you will explore one or more specific aspects of globalization processes. Here, you will develop (among other things) your skills in assessing and choosing among theories and methods, as well as competencies in delimiting and creatively analyse complex international and/or intercultural issues.

Organisation of the semester

In this semester you will be attending a number of ‘core courses’ as well as ‘stream courses’ of your own choice. You are not required to choose any line of stream specialization yet, but may decide to do so already. The four stream specializations offered are:

- Consumption and Market Communication
- Organisation and Leadership
- International Relations and the Global Order
- International Migration and Ethnic Relations

On the basis of core and stream courses you write your project (20 ECTS) in a group or individually. Also, you will be required to pass a module in ‘Philosophy of Science and methodology’ (5 ECTS), and finally an elective module (5 ECTS) within either an area specialization (currently we are offering Arctic Studies and Brazilian Studies), a topic study (a small-version project) or Academic Oral Communication.
